





So, WHAT ABOUT THOSE DAM HOUSES?

Y ou still see them around town. Some have been improved while others need to go but let's go back to why and when they came to be....




It's 1938 and construction begins on Shasta Dam. Workers and their families are coming and they need housing - such was the building of houses in what was called "Shasta Dam Village" or PCI Camp (Pacific Constructors Inc) located below the dam construction site on the east side of the Sacramento River canyon near the old mining town of Coram.

131 houses in all - thrown up in a hurry by Frank

Crowe's men hired to build a dam. Pine lumber siding and fiberboard composition walls - no insulation to speak of. One to five small rooms, a bath and washroom on the porch. An electric stove, ice box, nothing fancy as they were to be torn down or moved when the Dam was completed. No AC in the summer and an oil or wood




stove in the winter. The late Ella Fish Barbera recalled her rent was \$18 to \$21 a month others said it was 25% of their wages or about \$9.00 a week.




At the same time, houses were being built in Toyon (Government Camp), east of Summit City on Shasta Dam Boulevard to house the workers and

families employed by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation. These were also "Dam houses" but a little different construction. Family homes and duplexes



with an attached garage. Single men found

housing in the dormitories. Toyon was a community within itself with sidewalks, tennis courts, a community hall, dormitories, mess hall, and more. However, like the other Dam houses, these dwellings would also be torn down and/or sold by the USBR when the Dam was finished and the community of Toyon no longer existed.



Where did the houses move to? Well, to Summit City, Central Valley, Project City, Pine Grove, Redding and Anderson for sure and maybe even farther south.

In 1945, Veterans returning after WWII were seeking jobs and affordable housing and found work in the lumber mills. Gean Vonk at Anderson Historical Society wrote: "The Veterans

Park in Anderson, located below the high school between South Street and Veterans Lane, was one place where the houses were relocated. Shasta County donated the land for the housing project and according to H. Christensen, the Anderson Veterans Post#9650 was involved." *Next issue: Dam house stories and where some of the houses may still be located today.*





"Wyatt's Tavern" original building of C&G Bait. Located next to the Crestwood Lodge aka Anchor's Inn in Project City.




Memories of my Grandmother Eula Faye Galloway-Bowers.

My grandmother followed the fields from Arkansas to middle California, making her way to Big Bend or Pit 5 with my grandfather, Virgil Bowers. My grandfather worked for PGE as a lineman and together they had 6 children. They ended the journey in Central Valley where they would live and raise their children.

My grandmother, Eula, was a seamstress. She worked for the Hub and Thompson's men's clothing stores in Redding. She once sewed a suit for Flip Wilson (popular TV co-median in the 60's/70's) when he was passing through Redding.

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As a small child I remember Hobos stopping by for a quick meal. Later in life as I did some research, I discovered that there would be markings that the Hobos would leave to alert the next group. Shown is a sample. I am sure my grandmother had many on her post outside.



Kind hearted lady - kind woman- woman - housewife feeds for chores and Sit down feed - are what the markings denoted.

So many memories...I wish I could go back to her house on Flower Street and sit at her kitchen table. I can still remember the smell of bacon, see a dish towel hanging, laughing while playing a game of Yahtzee, drinking Pepsi from a bottle and doing the Twist Board as we tried to play Yahtzee or make calls on her rotary phone.



Of all the cherished items I have of my grandmother, the one I love the most is her *button box*. In an old cookie tin container, there were glass, wood, plastic, silver, and homemade buttons. I would run my fingers through this tin, as she would ask what my favorite button was and she would tell me how she found, bought or was given that button. Memories.....

And now I'm sharing a recipe with you, one of my favorite foods that grandma made, her famous raw apple cake. *Please enjoy, from my family to yours. Granddaughter, Joan Tavey- Fackrell*
